## Parking & Westside Light Rail

Portland Parks & Recreation has pay stations in the lots that serve the Oregon Zoo. Rates will be \$1.60 per hour with a daily maximum \$4.00. Parking is first-come-first-served and finding a space may be challenging on days when zoo attendance is high. The easiest access to the zoo is on TriMet MAX light rail.
